If the number belongs to a land line - in other words, it is a published number, you can further check the name and address of the person or business to whom it belongs. For toll-free numbers, in most cases, this info is also available for free.

Cell phone numbers, while unpublished and unavailable in public directories because Sprint, Verizon and other mobile providers do not publish a wireless directory, can still be traced by using a private directory service.

Back in the "old days" before the Internet, the only way to conduct a reverse cell phone look up was to hire an expensive private investigator. And private investigation services are still available for people who need to track down a restricted number. But in most cases, you will be able to identify that number on your own by using one of the available directories and online tracking tools.

If you already have the number you need more information about, simply use the <u>free reverse lookup widget</u> that will check public and private databases to find name and address. If the number is restricted or blocked, or private call, you can use some tips found in <u>this post</u> on tracing blocked numbers.
